What we are asking you for

We would like to kindly ask you to provide us with the **consent form you used [in this study/study X in the paper]** in its original language (and English language, if available). We would also be interested in any **information materials given to participants** you used in this study beyond the consent form (this does not include instructions or stimulus materials, but rather procedural information about the study, participation, or data processing).

We understand that this may be a delicate topic as there is some uncertainty among social scientists as to how to properly formulate consent forms. For this reason, we would like to assure you that **all communication and materials will remain confidential**. Our report will only include summary data from which no included study can be identified.

For your study to be eligible, **(1) personal data** must have been collected, **(2)** data collection for the study must have taken place **within the European Union/European Economic Area (3)** on or after **May 24th, 2016**. From reading your paper, we believe that your study might be eligible, but of course, we would like you to confirm this. If it is not eligible, we would appreciate a short note, but we would no longer ask for sending the consent form.

Due to the timeline of our study, it would be great if you could respond to this email **within 3 weeks**.
