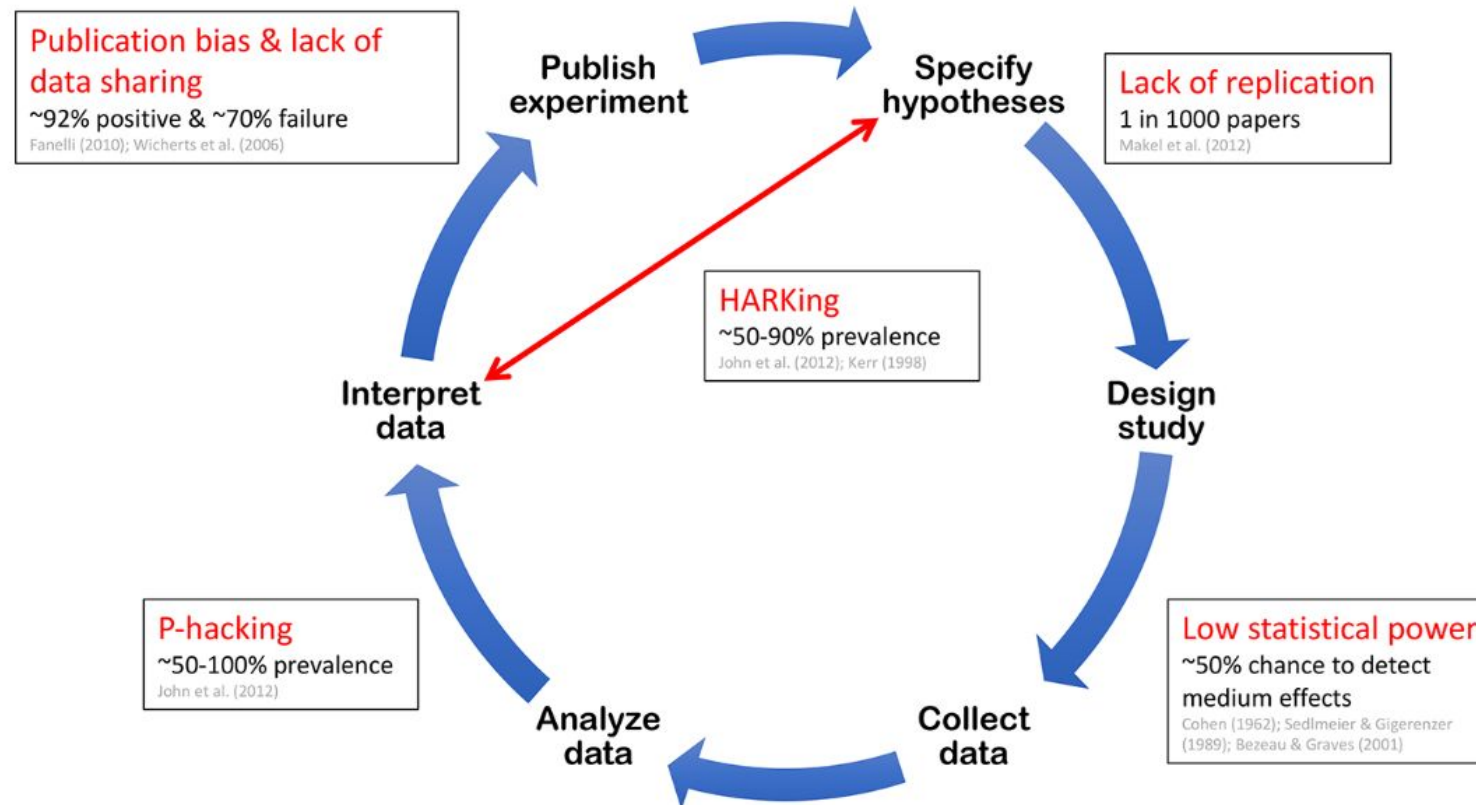

# RegReports - Why?

Foster trust in empirical science!

by enabling researchers to demonstrate that their studies have been conducted, analyzed, and reported as initially planned

# RegReports - For whom?

- Authors
  - can base their research on scientific and quality criteria - irrespective of the possible outcome
- Editors
  - can increase validity and replicability of their journal contents
  - establish a quality commitment and brand
- Readers
  - higher confidence in published results, because of reduced publication bias
- Funding agencies
  - efficient budget allocation by ensuring the proper publication of null results

# RegReports - How?

- Authors of empirical studies publish details regarding sampling, sample size and the plan for analysis *prior* to conducting the study
  - preregistered study protocols can be handled and peer-reviewed like an article
    - acceptance of preregistered study protocols based on method and quality of design, not on outcome
- Increase in robustness and replicability of psychological science

# RegReports - A silver bullet?

“The single cheap solution that will solve all of the problems in the entire world” (Goldacre, 2009)

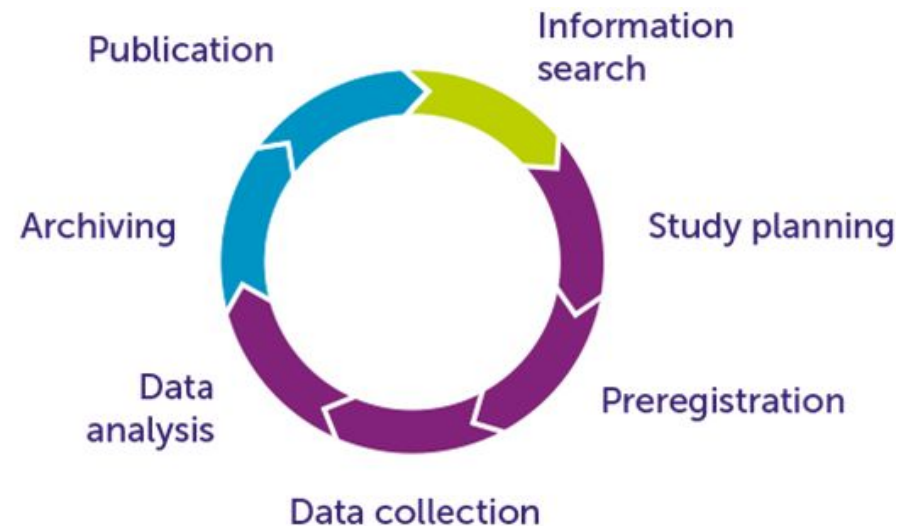
Several challenges remain

- incentive for authors to adopt preregistration formats
- integration for authors in writing a study protocol
- integration and decision aids for reviewers
- integration into journal systems for editors and readers



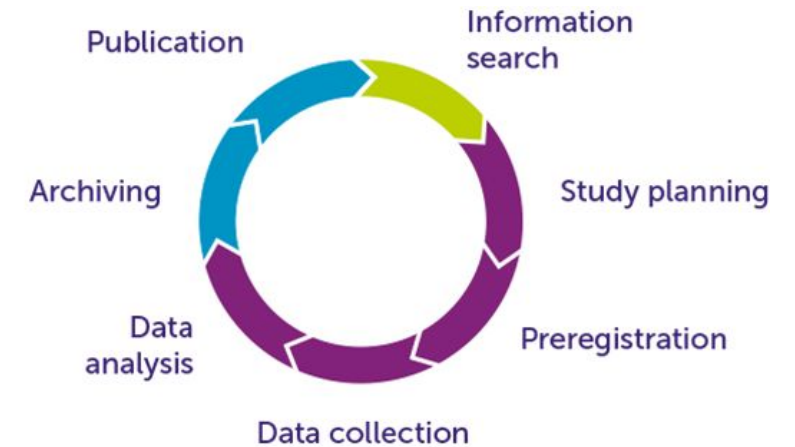
# RegReports - How?

ZPID is a Public Open Science Institute for Psychology and related disciplines



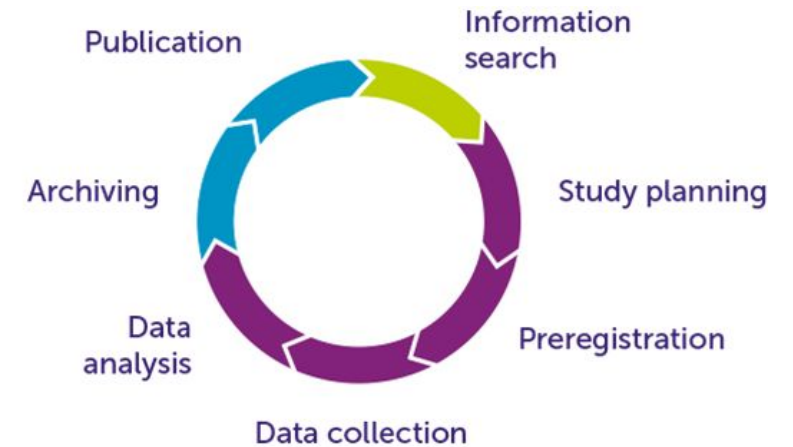
# RegReports - How?

- ZPID wants to enable preregistration
  - no normative statements
    - mission of associations like DGPs, APA, etc.
  - Supporting pre-registration by:
    - integrating preregistration into a research cycle
    - participating in developing and implementing joint standards (currently with: DGPs, Hogrefe, SIPS, APA, BPS, etc.)




# RegReports - How?

- ZPID wants to enable Registered Reports!
  - offering free and independent data collection services for successfully reviewed protocols
  - offering notarization and long-term preservation services
  - developing a service for authors and editors to create and review protocols (“RegReports”)
  - developing SMART-preregistration in PsychOpen GOLD (OA journals) (“SMART-Protocols”)



# RegReports - notarization and preservation

- PsychArchives
  - keep a copy of protocols with an independent third party (“notarization”)
  - connect and preserve protocol, data, analysis code, publication and all other digital research objects for a study in one place

# RegReports - service to create and review

- Platform populated with templates developed for psychological science
  - technology based e.g. on protocols.io

Copy of Information Recommended for Inclusion in Manuscripts Reporting Meta-Analyses

Description Guidelines & Warnings Materials Steps +SHARE VIEW All changes saved

1 Title

State the research question and type of research synthesis (e.g., narrative synthesis, meta-analysis).

2 Author note

List all sources of monetary and in-kind funding support; state the role of funders in conducting the synthesis and deciding to publish the results, if any.

Describe possible conflicts of interest, including financial and other nonfinancial interests.

Give the place where the synthesis is registered and its registry number, if registered.

Provide name, affiliation, and e-mail address of corresponding author.

3 Abstract

**Objectives:**

State the research problems, questions, or hypotheses under investigation.

4 Abstract

**Eligibility criteria:**

Describe the characteristics for inclusion of studies, including independent variables (treatments, interventions), dependent variables (outcomes, criteria), and eligible study designs.

5 Abstract

**Methods of synthesis:**

Describe the methods for synthesizing study results, including

- Statistical and other methods used to summarize and to compare studies
- Specific methods used to integrate studies if a meta-analysis was conducted (e.g., effect-size metric, averaging method, the model used in homogeneity analysis)

6 Abstract

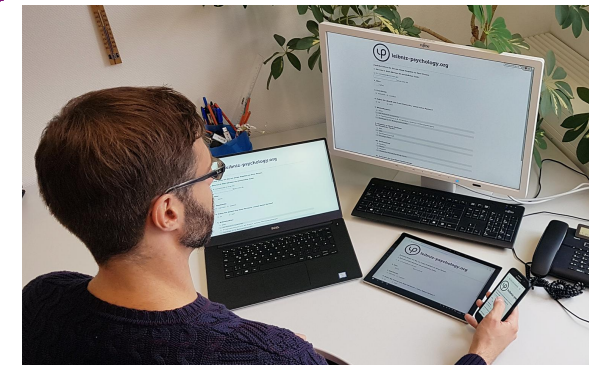
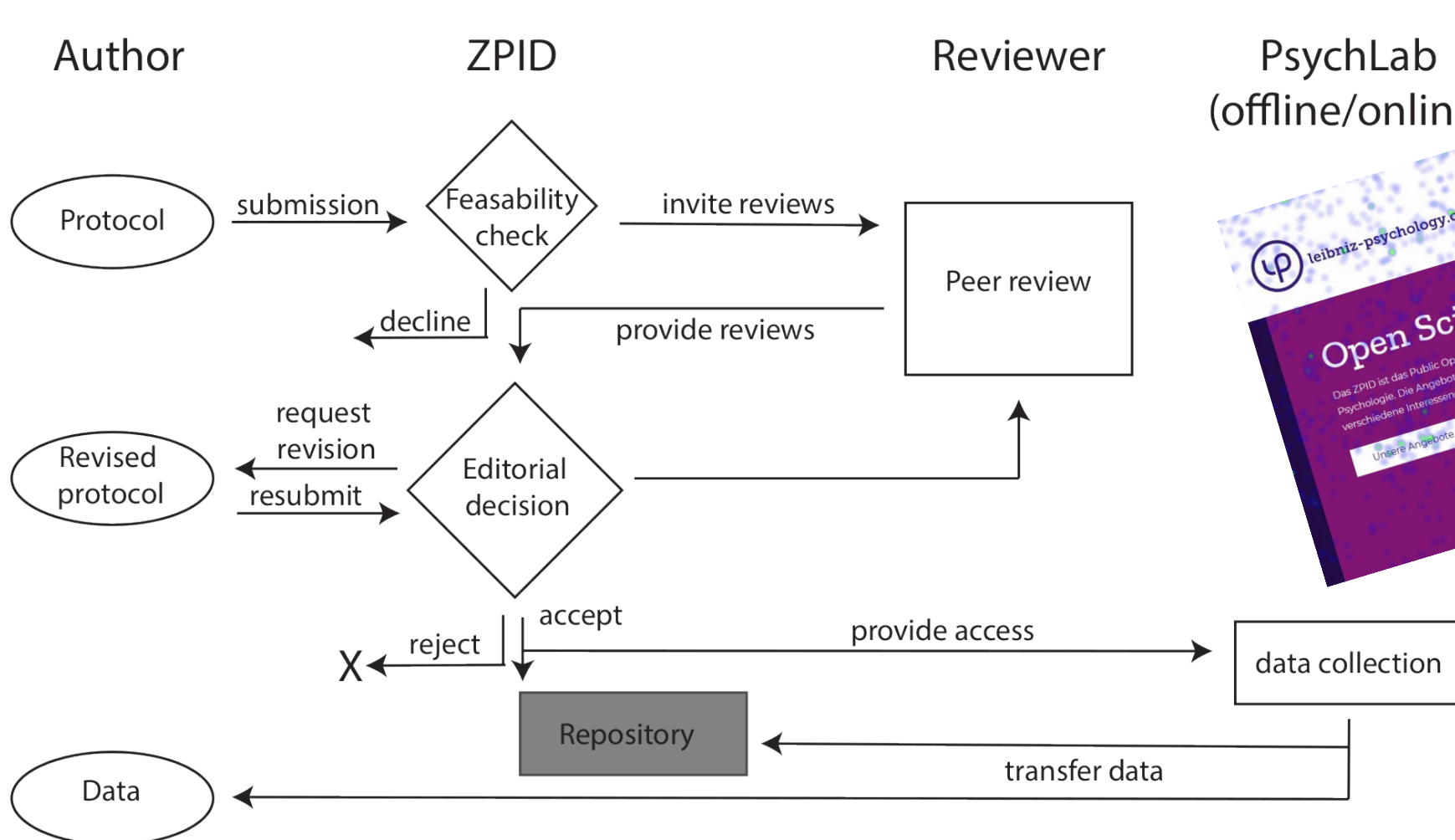
**Results:**

State the results of the synthesis, including

- Number of included studies and participants, and their important characteristics
- Results for the primary outcome(s) and moderator analyses
- Effect size(s) and confidence interval(s) associated with each analysis if a meta-analysis was conducted

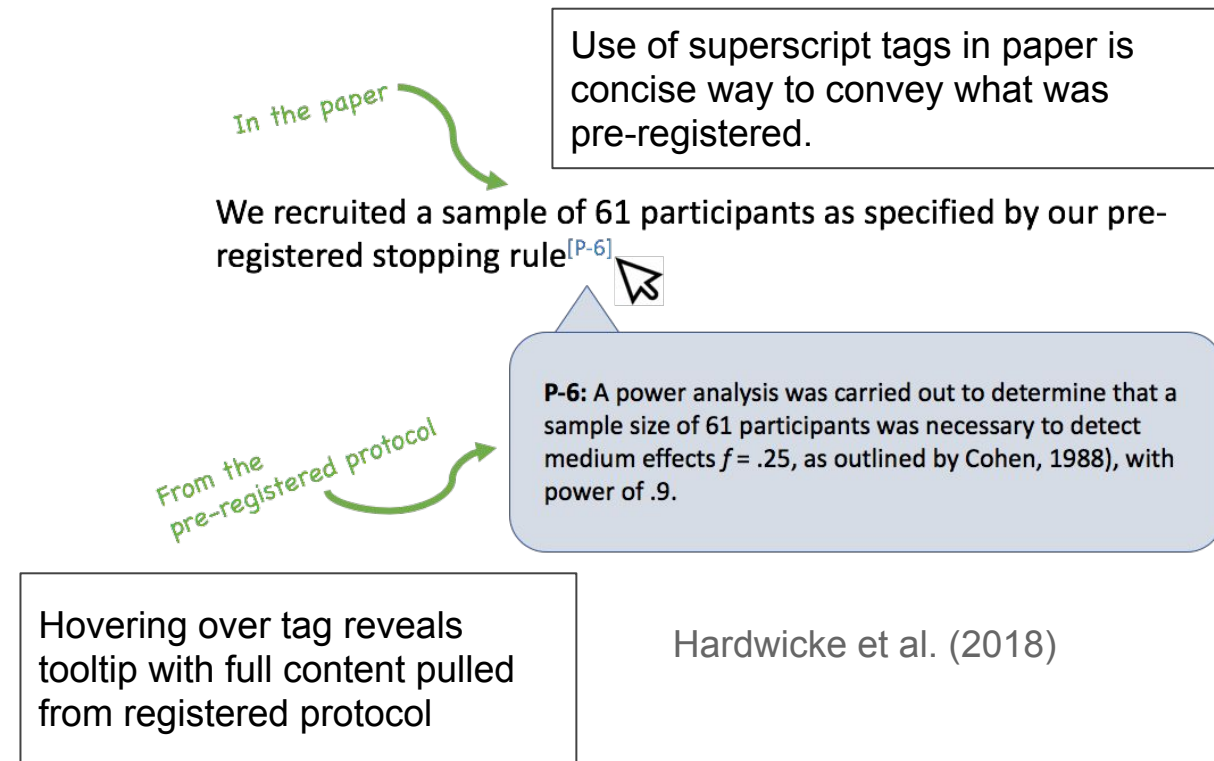


# RegReports - free data collection incentive



# RegReports - SMART-Preregistrations

- Deposit additional machine-readable version of protocols in PsychArchives
  - markup of individual sections within the protocol
- Implement display on journal side in PsychOpen GOLD OA journals



# RegReports - Perspectives

- 2019: prototype software for comfortably creating and reviewing protocols and notarizing them in PsychArchives
- 2020: PsychLab Offline incentive fully operational

We expect most of the proposed ideas to be transferable to other empirical sciences, as the approaches are not strictly specific for psychology and hope these domains can profit from our endeavours.
