**N=326, women only**

### Participants.

nursteach: P = nursery degree; U = - pedagogy students

residence: A = Country; B = to 10.000; C = 10.000-50.000; D = 50.000-100.000; E= 100.000-500.000; F = > 500.000

### Independent variable.

Mini\_K: Mini-K items (1-20 items without item No. 9).

The Mini-K – (Figueredo et al., 2006), which is a 20-item short-form measure of the ALHB (Arizona Life History Battery), assesses several domains of social and sexual behavior. In the present study the Mini-K was used as a proxy of somatic and parental effort (Łukasik et al., 2018). Item 9 (“I have a close and warm relationship with my own children”) has been removed as it was irrelevant due to the participants’ young age.

### Mediators.

mfq: MFQ - Moral Foundations Questionnaire items (1-30) The MFQ measures universal moral intuitions, (Graham, Haidt & Nosek, 2009; Haidt & Graham, 2009; Graham et al., 2011).

soc: The Body Esteem Scale items (1-35). The Body Esteem Scale (BES; Franzoi & Shields, 1984. consists of 35 items in three subscales: SA – Sexual Attractiveness, WC – Weight Control; PC – Physical Condition. In the present study BES was used to measure physical attractiveness.

### Independent variable.

SOIR: SOI-R-D items (7-8-9). The SOI-R (The revised Sociosexual Orientation Inventory; Penke, & Asendorpf, 2008). The revised Sociosexual Orientation Inventory assesses individuals’ openness to uncommitted sexual relationships. In our study we were only interested in the issues related to sociosexual desire (SOI-R-D), which consists of items 7–9.
