CISS and additional measures used in the proposed study

The Civic Identity Status Scale (CISS)

Please read each of the following statements about attitudes towards your civic rights, obligations and engagement. Then, indicate to which extend each of the statements reflects your own thoughts and feelings. If a statement has more than one part, please indicate your response to the statement as a whole.

- (D) I haven't really thought much about myself as an active citizen. I'm not too concerned about my civic rights and obligations.
- (M) There are many different ways to be an active part of the society. I haven't decided which one to follow, but I'm trying to figure it out.
- (A) I have practiced different civic behaviours and now I have a clear idea of which I want to take part in.
- (F) My parents know what's best for me in terms of my civic engagement.
- (A) I've spent time thinking about myself as a citizen, my civic obligations and actions, and I've decided on which ways of civic engagement will work best for me.
- (M) I really don't know what kind of a citizen I am. I'm still trying to figure out what kind of civic engagement feels right to me, and it's extend.
- (F) I only engage in civic behaviours my parents would approve of.
- (F) I've never really questioned my views on civic engagement and obligations. If they are right for my parents, they must be right for me.*
- (A) Based on past experiences, I've chosen the kind of civic engagement style that suits me best for the time being.
- (D) I don't think about my civic obligations and ways of civic participation. I just kind of take it as it comes.
- (M) I'm still trying to decide how capable I am as a person to participate in the community and what civic goals are right for me.
- (D) I haven't really considered whether I am an active part of the community. Civic engagement just doesn't interest me much.

Notes: Scored from 1 — Strongly disagree to 7 — Strongly agree; Letters in parentheses denote status/factor (D — diffusion; M — moratorium; A — achievement; F — foreclosure).

*Suggested rewording: I haven't really question my own views on civic engagement and obligations. I believe those of my parents are just right for me.

We believe such item would have clearer factor loadings as it retains the lack of identity exploration in the first sentence (while avoiding the word never, which might be too strong), but more clearly states the commitment of the emerging adult to civic views of their parents in the second sentence.
